Nagoya City Bus & Subway 1-Day Ticket
20XX.-11.-1
870 yen for adults
There is no specified date for the ticket.
Valid for initial day of use.



Donichi Eco Kippu (Weekend Eco Ticket)
20XX.-11.-1
620 yen for adults
This ticket can only be used on Saturdays, Sundays, national holidays, and the 8th day of each month. Valid for initial day of use.



Nagoya Subway 24-Hour Ticket
20XX.-11.-2
760 yen for adults
There is no specified date for the ticket. Valid for 24 hours.



Nagoya City Bus One-Day Ticket
20XX.-11.-1
620 yen for adults
There is no specified date for the ticket. Valid only for the initial day of use.

At ticket machines in subway stations, inside city buses, the Kanayama Tourist Information Center, Oasis 21 i Center and hotels.



Buy a One-Day Ticket to get special discounts and benefits in Nagoya!


1 Purchase a Weekend Eco Ticket or other qualifying ticket!




2 Travel by city bus or subway.



3 Show your ticket at participating facilities and businesses!



4 Get special benefits at 345 locations!!



By showing your One-Day Ticket issued by the Nagoya Transportation Bureau, you are entitled to get discounts and other services at selected facilities and sites on this guidebook. (Only tickets within their valid period after start of use are accepted.)

When you purchase a ticket from a ticket vending machine, the valid date is already printed on the front of the ticket.

When you purchase a One-Day Ticket in advance, the valid date is automatically printed on the back of the ticket when you insert the ticket into the slot on the ticket gate.

- Please show your One-Day Ticket upon entering each facility or site.
- In principle, only one person can get discounts and other services with one One-Day Ticket.
- No other coupons may be used in conjunction with One-Day Tickets.
- The content of this booklet is based on information collected from September 1 to 30, 2025.
- This guidebook is effective from November 1, 2025 to February 28, 2026.

Please show your One-Day Ticket upon entering each facility or site to get discounts and benefits on the guidebook.
(Only tickets within their valid period after start of use are accepted.)

How to purchase a One-Day Ticket at a ticket machine.



"English" display can be chosen on the ticket machine with touch panels.

On weekdays (Monday through Friday), buy a Nagoya City Bus & Subway 1-Day Ticket. On Saturdays, Sundays, national holidays and the 8th day of each month, buy the Weekend Eco Ticket.

Choose the type of One-Day Ticket most suited for your destinations and purposes:

- Nagoya Subway 24-Hour Ticket (all subway lines) : **760 yen for adults.**
- Nagoya City Bus & Subway 1-Day Ticket (all subway lines & city bus routes) : **870 yen for adults.**
- Weekend Eco Ticket (all subway lines & city bus routes) : **620 yen for adults.**

- Tickets from ticket machines only valid on day of purchase.
- Nagoya Subway 24-Hour Tickets from a ticket machine must be used for the first time on day of purchase.

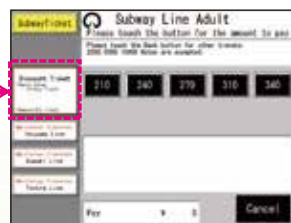
Steps to follow when purchasing a Weekend Eco Ticket



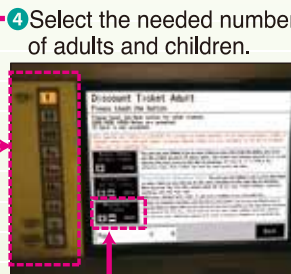
1 Select "English" at the top left corner of the touch panel.



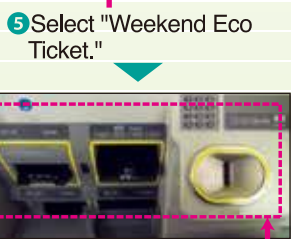
2 Select "Ticket."



3 Select "Discount Ticket."



4 Select the needed number of adults and children.



5 Select "Weekend Eco Ticket."



6 Pay using cash or an accepted IC Card.

Subway entrance



This mark stands for the Nagoya Subway system.

The name of the station in both Japanese and English, and the Exit No. are indicated.

How to ride the subways

Insert your One-Day Ticket through the slot on the ticket gate, and pass through the gate.



Use It for Buses, Too!

You can also use the One-Day Bus and Subway Ticket and the Weekend Eco Ticket to ride city buses. Please note that the Nagoya Subway 24-Hour Ticket cannot be used to ride city buses.

City Center Loop Bus (C-758 Line)

This bus departing from the city center of Nagoya makes a loop of the Sakae and Osu areas.

Major Stops

Nagoya Eki (Nagoya Sta.) - Yanagibashi - Nayabashi - Hirokoji Sakae - Nadia Park - Yaba-cho - Furarie - Osu Himmachi-dori - Kamimaezu - Hirokoji Sakae - Nayabashi - Yanagibashi - Nagoya Eki (Nagoya Sta.)

● Fare: 210 yen for adults and 100 yen for children

● Days of operation: daily

Service every 10 minutes during daytime hours

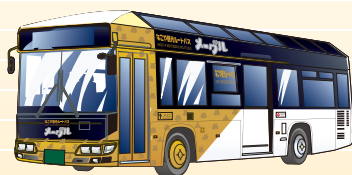
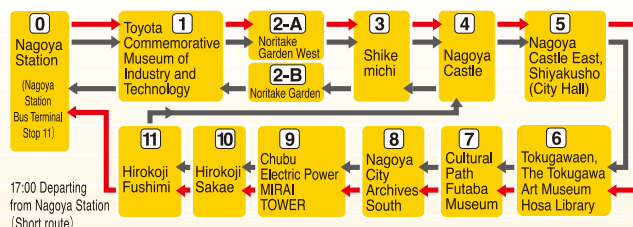


Guide Map



Me~guru Nagoya Sightseeing Route Bus

Me~guru makes a loop around the city of Nagoya, stopping at key tourist sites and facilities.



Look for this circular, swirl-mark on the sign.



● Fare: 210 yen for adults and 100 yen for children

● Days of operation: Tuesday through Sunday

● Not in service: every Monday (or the next day when Monday falls on a holiday) and from December 29 through January 3

Popular Spots in Nagoya



Nagoya Food

Hitsumabushi



Atsuta Horaiken (Hitsumabushi)

This is Nagoya-style eel and rice medley. It features chopped broiled eel sprinkled on a bowl of rice, and is customarily eaten in four equal portions: the first serving just as it is, the second serving with chopped green onion, nori seaweed, and other condiments sprinkled on, and the third with broth poured over to make a soup. For the last, you eat it however way you prefer.

Miso Katsu (Pork Cutlets with Miso Sauce)



Yabaton (Waraji Tonkatsu)

Miso katsu is a dish that originated in the region of Nagoya, Aichi Prefecture, and is considered an example of Nagoya cuisine. Deep-fried breaded pork cutlets are topped with a hot and tangy miso sauce (a blend of red miso with sake, sugar, mirin, soup stock, and other ingredients).

Tebasaki (Chicken Wings)



Torikai Souhonke (Tebasaki)

These juicy and richly flavorful chicken wings are made using Nagoya Cochin chickens, one of Japan's three leading heritage breeds of poultry. These won the gold prize in the "Tebasaki" division of the Karaage Grand Prix fried-chicken competition. These are sure to delight any fan of poultry dishes!

Misonikomi Udon



Yamamotoyahonten (Misonikomi Udon)

This is thick udon noodles cooked in an earthenware bowl of soup made using soybean miso. It is known as an example of Aichi Prefecture's regional cuisine. Variations include Nagoya Cochin misonikomi udon made using the Nagoya Cochin heritage breed of chicken.
