

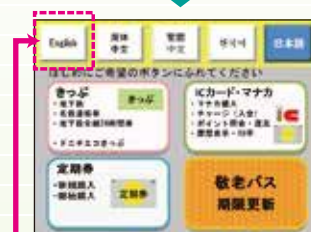
"English" display can be chosen on the ticket machine with touch panels.

On weekdays (Monday through Friday), buy a Nagoya City Bus & Subway 1-Day Ticket. On Saturdays, Sundays, national holidays and the 8th day of each month, buy the Weekend Eco Ticket.

Choose the type of One-Day Ticket most suited for your destinations and purposes:

- Nagoya Subway 24-Hour Ticket (all subway lines) : **760 yen for adults.**
- Nagoya City Bus & Subway 1-Day Ticket (all subway lines & city bus routes) : **870 yen for adults.**
- Weekend Eco Ticket (all subway lines & city bus routes) : **620 yen for adults.**
- Tickets from ticket machines only valid on day of purchase.
- Nagoya Subway 24-Hour Tickets from a ticket machine must be used for the first time on day of purchase.

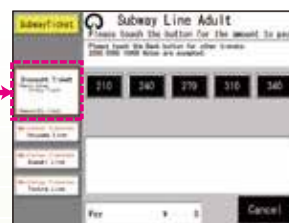

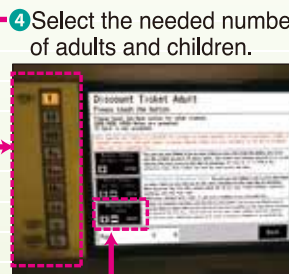

Use It for Buses, Too!

You can also use the One-Day Bus and Subway Ticket and the Weekend Eco Ticket to ride city buses. Please note that the Nagoya Subway 24-Hour Ticket cannot be used to ride city buses.

City Center Loop Bus (C-758 Line)

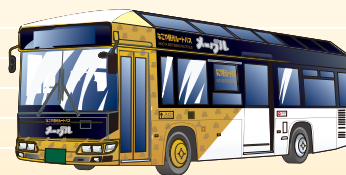
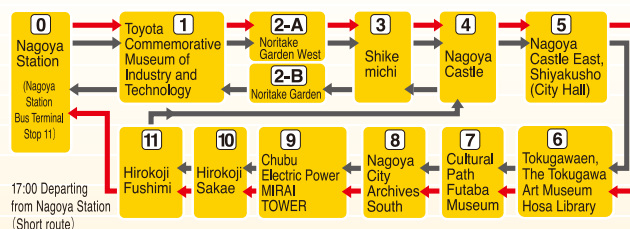

Popular Spots in Nagoya



CHUBU Electric Power MIRAI TOWER
Using the world's first such construction method of its kind, seismic base isolation was completed to maintain the tower's appearance from when it was built and transform it into the safe and secure MIRAI TOWER. An indoor observation deck is located at a height of 90 meters. It affords panoramic views of Nagoya, whose nighttime scenery has been designated an example of the Night View Heritage of Japan.
The Nagoya TV Tower was renamed the CHUBU Electric Power MIRAI TOWER on May 1, 2021.

Nagoya Castle

The mythical golden rooftop shachi figures are a well-known symbol of Nagoya. This castle was constructed by Tokugawa Ieyasu. Restoration of the Honmaru Palace was begun in 2009. After some ten years of work, restoration was completed and the structure reopened to the public in 2018. (The Main Castle Tower is currently closed.)

Tokugawaen Garden

This Japanese garden is a re-creation of the daimyo gardens of the feudal Edo period. It offers beauty that can be enjoyed throughout the seasons, including fresh new greenery, colorful autumn foliage, flowers such as peonies and irises, and more.

Osu

Osu Kannon temple symbolizes the neighborhood of Osu. In the area's shopping arcade you can enjoy finds ranging from household electronics to used clothing, *otaku* subculture, and local Nagoya-style dining.

Port of Nagoya Public Aquarium

This large-scale public aquarium is situated adjacent to urban Nagoya. It includes many varied species of marine life on display, and also features dolphin performances and other events. Here you can encounter 50,000 examples of a diverse array of sea life belonging to 500 species.

白鳥庭園

Shirotori Garden

This Japanese garden in a style that features a path around a pond is among the largest of its kind in the Tokai region, covering an area of 3.7 hectares, and has a motif based on the geography of central Japan's Chubu region.

Atsuta Jingu Shrine

Atsuta Jingu, a shrine located in Atsuta-ku, Nagoya, Aichi Prefecture, has a history of 1,900 years. Known as the most important Shinto shrine besides Ise Grand Shrine, Atsuta Jingu is a serene spiritual oasis for locals in the heart of the bustling metropolis.

Atsuta Horaiken (Hitsumabushi)

This is Nagoya-style eel and rice medley. It features chopped broiled eel sprinkled on a bowl of rice, and is customarily eaten in four equal portions: the first serving just as it is, the second serving with chopped green onion, nori seaweed, and other condiments sprinkled on, and the third with broth poured over to make a soup. For the last, you eat it however way you prefer.

Tebasaki (Chicken Wings)



Torikai Sohonke (Tebasaki)

These juicy and richly flavorful chicken wings are made using Nagoya Cochin chickens, one of Japan's three leading heritage breeds of poultry. These won the gold prize in the "Tebasaki" division of the Karaage Grand Prix fried-chicken competition. These are sure to delight any fan of poultry dishes!

Miso Katsu (Pork Cutlets with Miso Sauce)



Yabaton (Waraji Tonkatsu)

Miso katsu is a dish that originated in the region of Nagoya, Aichi Prefecture, and is considered an example of Nagoya cuisine. Deep-fried breaded pork cutlets are topped with a hot and tangy miso sauce (a blend of red miso with sake, sugar, mirin, soup stock, and other ingredients).

Misonikomi Udon



Yamamotoyohonten (Misonikomi Udon)

This is thick udon noodles cooked in an earthenware bowl of soup made using soybean miso. It is known as an example of Aichi Prefecture's regional cuisine. Variations include Nagoya Cochin misonikomi udon made using the Nagoya Cochin heritage breed of chicken.
